

ANNUALS - CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Annuals perform best when placed in fresh potting soil for hanging baskets and planters. In garden beds, it is recommended to amend your garden soil with compost when planting. The better your soil is, the better your plants will perform.

Consistent watering during the warm summer months is a challenge. Most annuals do not like to be too wet, or too dry.

Fertilizing can be done with granular or time-release plant food at planting time and supplemented bi-weekly with a water soluble product.

Grooming your annuals is very important if you want them to stay healthy and nice looking all season. Stake and/or support should be provided before a tall plant falls over. Picking faded and spent blooms is important to keep your plants blooming and preventing them from going to seed.
